	BUILT BY HORACE STAPLES FOR THE FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF WESTPORT IN 1873, THE BUILDING HAS BEEN USED OVER THE YEARS AS EVERYTHING FROM A TOWN MEETING HALL TO A FURNITURE STORE.
	NATIONAL HALL WAS COMPLETELY RESTORED, THIS TIME AS A FOUR DIAMOND LUXURY HOTEL, BEGINNING IN 1987 THANKS TO THE GENEROSITY AND FORESIGHT OF ARTHUR TAUCK.

	SAVING THE BUILDING WASN'T EASY. TIDAL WATER WAS SEEPING INTO THE BUILDING TWICE A DAY, TURNING THE BASEMENT INTO A SWIMMING POOL. THE FLOODING TOOK ITS TOLL ON THE FOUNDATION. ARTHUR HAD THE ENTIRE STRUCTURE STRAPPED TOGETHER AND RAISED WHILE WORKERS BUILT A NEW FOUNDATION UNDERNEATH IT. TODAY IT STANDS AS A TESTAMENT TO WESTPORT'S AMAZING HISTORY.
 DRIVER BULLET POINTS: The Inn at National Hall, a world-class luxury hotel, occupies most of the building. The building was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1984. The whole street became a Historic Design District 1994.
